



Filters Coils, Drain Pan, Pump Fan **Entire Housing**




Options for Cleaning?

Cleaning

You may have to clean in place if the drain pan can't be removed......

- Power washing of the coils, fan, drain pan and components takes place with the cover off and the unit assembled.
- Not as through as disassembly.
- Water may blow from fan a few minutes after starting.












Cleaning

If the drain pan unclips/screws and comes out, the fan should be removable.





























